Accommodation

A block of rooms is available at the Coast Bastion Hotel at a rate of \$165.00 per night (single/double occupancy) for a "Comfort" room, most with two double beds. There is an additional \$20 per night per person for triple or quadruple occupancy. All room types will have a "Juliette" balcony with views of Nanaimo Harbour. Rooms will be reserved under the conference name **until April 3, 2024**. After that date, rooms will be returned to the general pool of rooms available.

Due to delayed renovations at the hotel we have now been advised that some of the rooms available for the conference have a king sized bed and a pullout couch. We hope that arrangement will work for you.

Transportation – (Complimentary Pick-up and/or Drop-off)

BC Ferries - from Horseshoe Bay or Tsawwassen – registrants who request pickup and drop-off at BC Ferry terminals (Departure Bay or Duke Point) will be met, and driven to and from the hotel, by our volunteers. Taxis are also available from both terminals at around \$15 from Departure Bay, and \$50 from Duke Point to the hotel.

Hullo Ferry - downtown Vancouver to downtown Nanaimo. Hullo Ferry provides a complimentary shuttle to and from the Coast Bastion hotel.

Helijet - downtown Vancouver to downtown Nanaimo. Registrants should register for pick-up and drop-off by our volunteers; the complimentary shuttle service is sporadic.

Nanaimo Airport – Registrants who request pick-up and drop-off will be met and driven to and from the hotel by our volunteers. Taxis are available at around \$50 to the hotel. A commercial shuttle can also be reserved at 778-441-2133.

Photo credit ©Kendra Parnham-Hall "Where the Whales Are" will be a presentation dedicated to the importance of speaking for the ocean and how to help inspire positive change in a changing world.

The presenter is Jackie Hildering, Humpback Whale researcher, cofounder and communications lead with the <u>Marine Education and</u> <u>Research Society</u> based in the Territory of the Kwakwala speaking peoples, northern Vancouver Island. Jackie is known as "The Marine Detective" and is also a cold-water scuba diver and underwater photographer.

She will share lessons learned - from a previously undocumented Humpback Whale feeding strategy; to the plight of Sunflower Stars; to the human psychology that leads to disconnect from life in dark seas and to the paralysis that overwhelms and limits socio-environmental change. Jackie's on-camera experience includes work with PBS, the BBC, and Animal Planet.

2:15 pm - 3:15 pm Ay Lelum – The Good House of Design

Aunalee Boyd-Good and Sophia Good are the epitome of women making waves. They are the second wave of Coast Salish designers working in a family artist collective from the Snuneymuxw First Nation in Nanaimo. These sisters are the face of Ay Lelum - The Good House of Design, and are the creative forces behind the brand. They work with and are mentored to this day by their parents, Dr. William Good, a Hereditary Chief, master carver, and cultural historian, and Sandra Moorehouse Good, artist, painter and clothing designer. Their designs feature the work of their brother Joel Good, a traditional Coast Salish carver.

Aunalee and Sophia will speak to us about the transformation of art and knowledge between generations and how their designs meld traditional art, culture, music, language, and textiles to create beautiful, wearable art. Ay Lelum's clothing lines and music are a modern form of storytelling that intends to preserve and amplify culture, bridging the gap between the past and the present, featuring the duality of the two worlds they live in.

Ay Lelum's awards include the 2018 Indigenous Business of the Year Award, and the City of Nanaimo's Culture and Heritage Award in 2021. Their designs have been showcased in numerous Fashion Weeks including New York's Fashion Week. Their couture pieces have been featured in numerous publications like Vogue, Elle, and Harper's Bazaar. Their original music has been featured in numerous video and film projects and is available on major streaming platforms.

A registered dietician currently working with the Nuuchahnulth Health Authority, Jen Cody has 25 years of experience in the field of food sovereignty and food systems development. Past Executive Director of Nanaimo Foodshare Society, she has spearheaded programs and projects to provide not just access to food, but also to building skills, farming capacity, food literacy and worker supply. She recognizes that collaboration among and within community groups offers innovative solutions to resolving food security issues.

As Co-founder and Director of the <u>Growing Opportunities Farm Community Co-op</u>, her passion includes embracing human diversity and creating opportunities for all. Unlike cooperatives that exist for the benefit of their members, this community service cooperative exists for the benefit of the community. Growing Opportunities provides a wide scope of work both for volunteers and for meaningful employment for underrepresented and marginalized groups. The Co-op provides subsidized produce to community organizations such as the Unitarian Shelter Nanaimo, Stone Soup and the Clay Tree Society.

Jen will share her learning about the root causes of food insecurity, and the collaborative paths organizations and individuals can travel to create thriving food secure communities.

Linda Brooymans, Stewardship Manager at the Nanaimo Area Land Trust (NALT).

Linda started working with NALT in 2020. She has a Masters degree in anthropology, having worked with First Nations in Deline NWT and Waswanipi Quebec. Through this she has learned that experience on the land, or 'in Nature' is the best way to develop and maintain an ethic of care and stewardship for everything from our forests, streams and meadows to our parking lots and boulevards. This is why she works to develop and promote stewardship projects in which all community members can participate.

Linda will introduce NALT – a community-based organization working on numerous projects around Nanaimo in the areas of stewardship and conservation. These include a native plant nursery, a pollinator program, a number of Conservation Covenants, and several other programs. Of particular note for the conference theme, Linda will share about the innovative School Water Stewards program. Created by NALT, the program helps foster a culture of stewardship in students by providing them with opportunities to learn about and interact with local freshwater resources and their associated ecosystems.
